Students must also meet the College of Education certification requirements for general certification and entry into the program. A total of 2000 paid agriculturally based hours of work within the past 6 years are required for the Career & Technical certificate in Agriculture (this is not a WSU graduation requirement but is a requirement to obtain a CTE certificate to teach Agricultural Education in Washington).
