Since 1977, *The Western Journal of Black Studies* (WJBS) has been a leading interdisciplinary journal that is devoted to publishing scholarly articles, from a wide range of disciplines, that focus mainly on the experience of African Americans in the United States of America. The journal publishes articles that, as its name implies, report original investigations and contribute new knowledge and understanding to the field of Black/African American studies. Theoretical articles and works concerning the African Diaspora are welcome if whenever possible they include data research and implications for applicability. *All manuscripts are selected by blind peer review.*

INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Please observe the following guidelines when submitting articles to WJBS:

•Format of the manuscript must adhere to the convention of style described in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (6th ed.). Please use references, not footnotes or endnotes.

•Include a separate title page that lists all authors, departmental affiliations and a mailing address for correspondence. Because of the blind review process, the only place the author's name may appear is on a separate title page.

•Manuscripts should be approximately 5 to 30 pages (including references) and must contain an abstract of approximately 120 words.

•Submit manuscripts via email to wjbs@mail.wsu.edu

•Double space all lines including block quotations, notes and figure captions and leave at least a 1-inch top/bottom, left/right margin.

•Submit a cover letter that requests review of the manuscript. This cover letter should adhere to the guidelines found in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (6th ed.). In addition, include a statement that the manuscript is not under consideration elsewhere nor has it been published in whole or in part in another journal.

•It is the author's responsibility to secure permission to reproduce quoted text, tables or figures from a copyrighted source. If it is required, you must obtain written permission and enclose a copy with your manuscript submission.

•Final version of the accepted manuscript must be accompanied by a Copyright Transfer Agreement signed by all authors.

•Authors of accepted manuscripts will receive notification of acceptance and instructions for publication (e.g., revisions needed before publication, camera ready figures, diskette version of manuscript, etc.).

•*Manuscripts that do not follow these guidelines will be returned to the author for correction prior to review.*
