

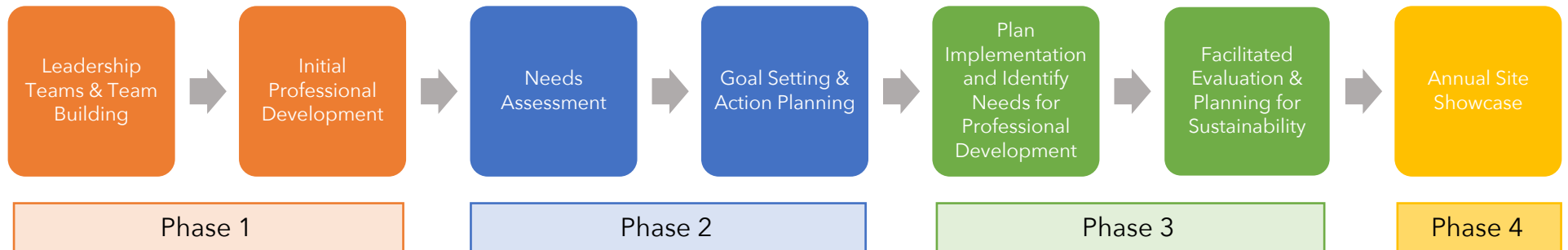


WASHINGTON TRANSITION PROGRAM

Essential Features of the Washington Transition Program (WTP)

The Washington Transition Program (WTP) will build local capacity to improve coordination between schools and Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) and increase the availability and accessibility of coordinated transition services for youth and young adults with disabilities, including pre-employment transition services. Pilot sites will develop a local transition leadership team that includes key players involved in the coordination and delivery of school and community based transition services. These teams will be guided by a WTP Technical Assistance Provider from Washington State University (WSU) through team building, self-assessment, action planning and evaluation activities focused on improving the coordination and delivery of services, and will participate in cross-site learning. Key players must have a passion for creative problem solving and improving student outcomes, and support from administrators to join the team. It's estimated that each team member will need to devote about a few hours/week to the process during the school year.
