I'm Determined Project

The I'm Determined project is a state-directed project funded by the <u>Virginia Department of Education</u> that focuses on providing direct instruction, models, and opportunities to practice skills associated with self-determined behavior. This resource helps youth with disabilities to undertake a measure of control in their lives.

Motivational Enhancement Group Intervention

Motivational Enhancement Group Intervention (MEGI) is an evidence-based 12-session career development intervention. It combines evidence-based transition practices with motivational interviewing to increase students' with disabilities self-advocacy/self-determination skills and vocational outcome expectations (Sheftel et al., 2014).

National Parent Center on Transition and Employment

Founded in 2014, PACER's National Parent Center on Transition and Employment provides high quality assistance on transition topics. This project focuses on the needs of families to help youth with disabilities find success in postsecondary education, employment, and life in the community by providing online materials and trainings for youth, parents, and professionals on best practices.
